Lower View looking south from a different standpoint; the Grand Cañon in the distance with the opening of the inner gorge—Upon the brink of the gorge stands the Crater Vulcan's Throne. The lower Toroweap Valley is on the left. South of the Cañon is another lateral Valley along which runs the Toroweap fault dropping the platform on west (right). The fore and middle grounds are filled with many basaltic craters. The darkly shaded spots are very recent outpours of basalt.
